Spotlight on Music

Music is a creative and inspiring subject which teaches children about rhythm, expression and confidence. Our pupils will explore music from different times, genres and cultures whilst developing a personal taste. Through singing, body percussion or musical instruments, they will hone their musical skills and creativity. This week's learning can be seen in the table below:

| Year Group | Music |
|--------------|--|
| Foundation 1 | Pupils have sung, listened and responded to a range of traditional nursery rhymes. They have used untuned percussion instruments to accompany songs. They have shown an awareness of the musical elements of pitch and pulse. |
| Foundation 2 | Pupils have explored simple songs, including Big Bear Funk developing their understanding of high and low notes and simple rhythms. They have used the glockenspiels this term to learn notes C, D, E. They have copied rhythms and created simple repeated patterns/ riffs to some phrases from the song. |
| Year 1 | Pupils have performed songs in unison and two parts developing their understanding of pulse, rhythm and melody. They have composed a class composition on glockenspiels using up to 5 notes for a song 'Your Imagination.' They have listened to and appraised a variety of music including pop and film genres. |
| Year 2 | Pupils have learnt a variety of songs of different styles including a South African song,' Music is All Around,' and Coronation song. They have developed their understanding of pitch, melody, rhythm and used tuned percussion 'Glockenspiel' for composing accompaniments. They learnt about the different sections of the orchestra and sung the Orchestral Song. |
| Year 3 | Pupils have listened to and responded to a variety of musical genres including classical and pop music. They listened to Coronation music including 'Zadok the Priest'; and learnt a Coronation song. Pupils explored pop/disco genre through the song 'Bringing Us Together', learning up to five notes on glockenspiel for an accompaniment and recognising notation and rests |
| Year 4 | Pupils have been singing songs for the school play. Pupils have been learning to play the d and g string on the violin. |
| Year 5 | Pupils have been singing songs for the school play. Learning to play a chord on the violin. |
| Year 6 | Pupils have been singing songs for the school play. Digital composing using 2Music Identifying and discussing the main elements of music: Pulse, Rhythm, Tempo, Pitch, Texture. |









Spotlight on Computing

We have an inspiring computing curriculum. Pupils are taught the principles of information and computation, how digital systems work, and how to put this knowledge to use through programming. Building on this knowledge and understanding, pupils are equipped to use information technology to create programs, systems and a range of content. Through the study of computing, children will be able to develop a wide range of fundamental skills, knowledge and understanding that will equip them to navigate the digital world safely.
