## **Democracy**

At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, we believe in celebrating our community's increasingly diverse cultural backgrounds whilst promoting and holding true to what we recognise as British Values.

Democracy is at the heart of our values. The children have been following Christ's

teachings by making decisions about their learning and behaviour towards each other.

Pupils are taught to listen carefully, with concern for each other, respecting the rights of every individual to have their opinions and voices heard. Last week, pupils were given the opportunity to vote for House Captains, Eco Council and Sports Council representatives. Next week, the pupils are voting for their School Council representatives.

All school elections are based solely on pupil votes, reflecting our British electoral system and demonstrating democracy in action.

The pupils will then be given the opportunity to air their opinions and ideas through our School Council and regular questionnaires.

Our Head Boy and Girls are pupils who live out our vision statement 'to love and learn in the footsteps of Christ.' They are exemplary role models for the younger children by being a disciple of Christ. The Head Boy and Head Girls carry out a range of important tasks, including speaking with prospective parents when they tour the school, judging competitions, speaking at events or in presentations, meeting and greeting visitors and attending meetings with the Senior Leadership Team to discuss important issues and ways to improve the school.





**House Captains** 





House captains are pupils responsible for overseeing and coordinating activities within their respective houses. House captains are chosen through a selection process involving application, interviews and a pupil elections process.

Class apostles refer to pupils who are chosen or appointed to serve as a representative or leader within their class in matters related to faith and spirituality. The role of a class apostle is responsible for fostering a sense of unity, promoting spiritual growth, and encouraging their classmates to live out their Catholic faith.

Class apostles may engage in various activities, such as organising prayer

services or reflections, leading class discussions on religious topics, encouraging participation in religious events or retreats, and liaising between their classmates and staff.

Class apostles are selected by the pupils based on qualities such as leadership, maturity, and a strong commitment to their faith. Our Class Apostles are expected to be role models for their peers, embodying Catholic values and promoting a sense of community within their class.

At St Joseph's, we strive to ensure that all our children recognise their important role in continuing Christ's mission by promoting Social Justice and Service. Our Year 5 Pupils are our Caritas Ambassadors. They are the leaders of social action in our school and are involved in charitable acts and service projects.

# mportant Notices

## 1. Secondary School Transfer Information For Year 6 Parents

Secondary School admissions opened at the beginning of September and the closing date for all applications is 31st October 2023. We recommend that this form is completed by Thursday 19th October, so that any queries can be dealt with ahead of the deadline. Year 6 parents must complete the online form at <a href="www.hertsdirect.org/admissions">www.hertsdirect.org/admissions</a> and complete the school's Supplementary Information Form, which you can obtain from the school's website or during the school's Open Evenings.

Please note that all Catholic secondary schools require a Certificate of Catholic Practice, which can be obtained from your parish priest.

## 2. Pupil Premium Funding

In certain circumstances, schools can claim approximately £1,600 of extra funding per child for pupils whose parents receive various benefits. This funding is available to all eligible children in school, from Nursery to Year 6.

If you are eligible to claim this extra money, please apply directly using the following website: <a href="www.hertsdirect.org/freeschoolmeals">www.hertsdirect.org/freeschoolmeals</a>. Once successfully applied for, this funding will remain in place each year that your child is with us. However, you will need to reapply for the funding when your child moves from Foundation Stage to Key Stage 1 or from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2. If you have any queries, please speak to the School Office in confidence.

If you would like your child to make their First Holy Communion next year, please see Father John after Mass.



### 4. Healthy Lunches!

As a healthy eating school, we ask that your child has a healthy packed lunch. Children may have a daily treat, such as a chocolate biscuit. Crisps are only allowed on Fridays. Glass bottles or cans of fizzy drinks are not allowed. Fruit, dry fruit, water, squash and juice are also allowed at playtime.



## 5. Nut Allergies!

May I remind you that nuts are prohibited in school because we have a few children with nut allergies. This is a life-threatening condition, so please ensure your child's lunch or break time snack does not contain nuts or nut products, e.g. peanut butter, Nutella and cereal bars. Thank you.
